Match Report

Round 12 saw the tackers's line up against Bundoora W away on what appeared too many as quiet possibly the coldest game day morning we have had with a peak of around 6 degrees! As expected the tackers couldn't wait to get into the thick of it and from the outset made their intentions clear to Bundoora by positively sticking to their roles that were asked of them as well as keep and hold their zones for some wonderful rebound football for when weren't in possession.

Wonderful efforts by a spread of players included some 7 individual goal scorers. This occurred by being fair to our team mates and when it was their turn to be rotated through the forward line, opportunities presented and opportunities were taken with both hands literally. Our overhead marking efforts with two hands was being well rewarded by the umpire of the day. Our tackling just goes from strength to strength on a weekly basis and while there were a couple of overzealous efforts it is certainly the players endeavour to place a tackle that was most impressive.

Some memorable efforts came from players such as Elie Khalife who has earned himself the tag of General of defence after holding his lines and being very disciplined, and then when released into the midfield in the 3rd quarter totally dominated the ball use and created plenty of options and racked up centre clearances for by far his best match of the year. He then became known as "the Dominator" likening his efforts to that of the old Carlton champ. Ethan Lowe again dominated and led by example right from the start where he assisted with Alex Azzopardi to make up numbers for Bundoora who were 2 players short, so much so that I had to discipline him at the QTR time huddle for taking too many marks against us in our forward line!

Jude Harb had a tough as usual game by his standards leading the way with placing his head over the ball and running hard for his possessions, as did the likes of Felix MSB, Patty Davies, Nicolas Spataro and the running efforts of Zac Vaiano was something to behold. The space Zac created and options he gave to his team mates who were looking to pass off came together beautifully. Billy Rodda was unlucky not to have 2 goals to his name but worked hard at it for most the game being rewarded with plenty of possessions around the ground, as did Joshua Malkoun who laid some very strong tackles and again disposed of the ball precisely hitting his leading team mates on the chest. Alex Lukic also controlled the wings and flanks and streamed in seamlessly to provide 2 centring kicks to the top of the square instead of bombing in shot on goals to which both deliveries were rewarded with team goals. Alex also shepherded through a goal kicked by a team mate which is becoming quiet the theme amongst this group of tackers. They are really dragging in all players and getting as many of them involved throughout each and every match, very pleasing to see.

All up the tackers have gone from strength to strength but it is of the utmost importance to always stick to the roles asked of you by the coaches as well as to stand tall within your zones as when the ball was out of our possession and the opposition are chasing kicks there is only one place for it to go and that is into the waiting arms of our disciplined defenders.

A very disciplined effort given the very cold conditions and one that we could not have asked for anymore from you all, great effort.

Match Report

Parkside's oval, Pitcher Park showed all the ravages of winter. The ground looked as if its usual lush surface had been ripped up by hooligans. And what remained was as barren as the hills outside Queenstown. If that wasn't enough, the chill factor and slicing, dicing winds kept talking, let alone cheering, to a bare minimum.

In this less than welcoming setting, marauders from Preston plundered, taking the game and almost the heart from their hosts. Almost. One of the nicest moments of the day occurred as our Bullants headed to the kinda warm change-rooms at game's end. Parkside, arms linked together, as one, sang their team song with gusto, as they walked from the paddock, having been humbled to the tune of 118 points. That's spirit.

For the Bullants, with due respect to Parkside, it was little more than a training run. A couple of our lads kicked swags of goals and a number of players are starting to build into convincing footballers of skill. At the same time, there were signs that a core tenet of the game, teamwork, still needs a lot more development.

At quarter time, David, the coach implored players not to try and goal when kicking from the forward pocket. Rather, to centre the ball to the top of the goal square or seek out a team-mate with a better angle. This advice fell on deaf ears too many times. Against Parkside it might not matter. Against MacLeod (who we play next and are second on the ladder) it could be a factor in whether we win or not. In the only game the Bullants have lost this year our score was 3.9.

The other matter that came to mind watching Bullants today is our back-line. It was hardly tested and hasn't really been tested in 12 games. We have a very good forward line and a strong mid-field structure but the backline is susceptible. It's hard to see how well it might work when it hardly gets any work. As Tim, the assistant coach remarked at half time, after the ball had scarcely been sighted in that half of the ground for a quarter, "You poor guys, you must have frozen your chops off out there".

So this was a good win but equally, it was a chance to reflect on what the team has achieved and what it needs. More consistent teamwork, skills development across the whole team and a determined backline will add to what is already a very good side.
