Match Report

Match Report

It took the half time and three quarter time address to get the message through and when we finally clicked, the last quarter was fantastic to watch. The ball spent almost all quarter in our forward line and for a moment there, I was confident we had the game. But we were unable to convert and a late goal for Kew Comets sealed the match.

But we do know that when we switch on, we can match it with these teams. We did this for two quarters and there's no reason we can't do it for four. This is the focus of training this week. [Monday night](#) was tough at training, with the focus being on some hard running, manning up and the use of our handball. Our next game Sunday is against Ashburton Y, who we played a fortnight ago and gives the guys a fantastic opportunity to make up for the previous result.
